

## MINISTRY OVERVIEW



### **Glory House of Miami: *Vision, Mission, and Values***

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**Vision:** Transform to freedom and health those rescued from sex trafficking.

**Mission:** To provide a home and safe environment where rescued victims can be healed and fully transformed.

**Values:** Christ-centered, respect for human life, hope giving, excellence and integrity.

### **Glory House of Miami: *Calling and History***

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Our calling is rooted in Jeremiah 29:11 *“For I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and to bring you a future and hope in Christ Jesus”*.

In August 2011 the ministry was birthed.

- 2011 - Ministry was birthed out of a need to provide long-term care to sex traffic survivors. Glory House of Miami incorporated as a 501©3, a non-profit organization.
- 2013 - Fundraising and on-going community awareness for Glory House began.
- 2014/15- Full time Director hired, continue to create awareness and fundraising to purchase a home. Mentored 8 non-resident survivors and provided services thorough our partnerships and other organizations doing similar work.
- 2016 – We rented a 6-bedroom home, furnished and staff it, have welcomed 4 survivors.

### **Glory House of Miami: *Ministry Model and Program***

- **Referrals:** Survivors will be referred through domestic violence shelters, FBI, Homeland Security, State Attorney’s office, law enforcement, victim advocates, foster care facilities, ministries that rescue victims, Miami Dade County Violence Prevention Division.
- **Services Provided:** Holistic approach, providing spiritual, medical, mental health, social, legal support, reintegration, education, arts, vocational training, job and life skills training.
- **Community Engagement:** Community outreach, trafficking awareness events, networking, and social media. We have also created a Junior Board to go out to schools, churches and wherever they are welcomed to prevent this from happening to our youth.

### ***Why Glory House of Miami?***

- There is no residential long-term facility in Miami for sex traffic survivors, ages 18-25. If there is no place for survivors to heal, they go back to the lifestyle.
- Miami is one of the fastest growing cities for sex traffic and labor traffic occurrences.
- The focus of human traffickers is now shifting to target the average youth age 12-14.

### **Glory House of Miami: Human Resources**

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- Safe House volunteers: Nutritionists, Bookkeeper, GED tutors, job coaches, life-skills coaches, mentors, grant writers, educators, fundraisers, social workers.
  - Staffing progression: We have day and night and weekend caregivers. The survivors are cared for 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. A full time caregiver lives at the house.

  - Volunteers to create awareness and to do fundraising and get involved with the girls.
  - We need in-kind gifts of skills.
  - We need our monthly donors to increase.
  - For survivors: advocacy, jobs, mentorships, internships, scholarships, and social services.
  - Real estate property that we can own so we don't have to pay a mortgage payment, saving on operating costs.
  - We need 4 bikes for the resident survivors
  - We need 2 laptops for the ladies as they are going to school and is part of their requirement.
